Driver Knowledge Test

The Driver Knowledge Testing System (DKTS) is a software program that generates a knowledge test of 30 randomly selected test questions from a large pool. Topics covered include rules of the road, traffic signs, and general questions specific to the licence class being tested. The automated system enables each person to have a different test.

How does the DKTS work?

- The questions will be presented on a computer screen and you will use a mouse to select your answers.



- A multiple choice format is used.
- For each question, there will be a corresponding picture and four choices marked by the letters A to D. Please note that the air brake knowledge test has no pictures. Carefully read each question and all the potential answers. Choose the best answer by clicking on the corresponding letter.
- There is a practice test question to demonstrate how the system works.
- Once you have made an answer selection, you will have to confirm your choice by pressing the 'Yes' button. You will be asked "Is this your final answer?" You may still change your answer at this time. (You may also skip the question - see below.)
- Once you have committed to your final answer, the system will inform you immediately if the answer is correct or incorrect. If correct, the system will tell you and will direct you to the next question. If incorrect, the system will flash the correct answer in green, and your choice in red.
- A scoring key at the bottom of the screen keeps track of how many correct and how many incorrect answers have been given, and the remaining number of questions.

Skipping Questions

- Questions do not have to be answered in the order that they are presented.
- If you choose to skip a question, press the 'Skip' button. This question will then be brought forward later.
- You can only skip each question once. When the question comes back, you will then have to answer that question.
- For the air brake knowledge test, some questions cannot be skipped.

Passing or Failing

- In order to pass, you must correctly answer 25 out of the 30 questions.
- Once 25 questions are correctly answered, the test will be automatically stopped with a passing grade. On the other hand, if six questions are answered incorrectly, the test will be stopped and a fail will be recorded.
